Why Camp Tuscazoar?

Camp Tuscazoar represents more than 80 years of history and tradition. Since 1920, thousands of campers have spent hours, days and weeks in Tuscazoar's natural environment. The camp is unique, with its deep valleys, challenging hills, peaceful forests and spectacular views of Dover Dam and the Tuscarawas River valley. Camp Tuscazoar is rich in Ohio history as well. In the 1850's, most of the property was owned by the Zoarite settlers who operated an iron ore mine on the southern end. A stagecoach trail once passed near the camp and several American Indian tribes visited and lived in the river valley. The camp also contains several memorials to scouts and scouters who helped build and establish it. It is truly Ohio's most historic camp. And, Camp Tuscazoar continues to offer numerous benefits. Campers can learn to identify trees, plants, wildlife, build bridges and learn the constellations. They can spend the night in the wilderness, learning outdoor skills and survival techniques. They can study unique geological formations and push sleds through snow drifts during the Gold Rush Competitions. The Camp Tuscazoar Foundation is dedicated to preserving these opportunities for future generations of youth. We will keep the spirit burning at Camp Tuscazoar!
