Annual Gold Rush Competition scheduled for Feb. 15-17

Preparations continue for the 3rd annual Gold Rush Competition to be held February 15-17 at Camp Tuscazoar.

As in previous years, units will travel to sites throughout the camp, completing tasks requiring the use of a variety of skills such as firebuilding, knot tying, orienteering, first aid and teamwork.

Unit check-in will be from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. Friday evening at the stockade. Check-in for units not camping during the weekend will be at 8:30 a.m. Saturday morning at Duryee Lodge. Units should bring sleds or backpacks, depending on the weather conditions.

The competition will begin at 9 a.m. Saturday morning and will conclude at 4:30 that afternoon. Lunch will be from 12 to 1 p.m.

The units will be divided into three divisions. The senior division will consist of units aged above 13 1/2. The junior division will include units with an age between 11 and 13 1/2. The cub division will be composed of units aged below 11.

Suggested sizes for units are four to eight people. Prizes will be awarded to the top three units in each division.

The cost for each participant, not including camping fees, is \$3. This fee includes a handsome Gold Rush patch designed by Harley Sefert of the Zoar Community Association.

At 8 p.m. Saturday, awards will be presented at a campfire at the Hoover Lodge amphitheater. Also, a Sunday morning church service will be held at Tom's Chapel.

Canal corridor extended to Tuscazoar

The Ohio and Erie Canal Corridor Coalition (OECCC) announced recently that it had approved the extension of the Ohio and Erie Canal Corridor to Camp Tuscazoar. The corridor, which had previously ended at Zoar, will now include both Zoarville and the camp.

The purpose of the OECCC is to stimulate public interest and support for the protection, preservation, development and enhancement of historical, cultural, natural, industrial, commercial and recreational resources along the route of the historic Ohio and Erie Canal.

The Ohio and Erie Canal Corridor now extends from the Lake Erie shore in Cleveland to Camp Tuscazoar, a distance of about 70 miles.

In Tuscarawas County, the canal followed alongside the Tuscarawas River. The entire 308-mile canal route was opened in 1832 and helped establish the communities of Akron, Massillon, Dover and Coshocton.
