## Adventurous activities planned for Dover Dam Weekend, May 3-5

Camp Tuscazoar's eighth Dover Dam Weekend will offer a variety of challenging, fun activities throughout the camp.

Visitors will have an opportunity to hike to Dover Dam and tour this massive concrete structure. Since 1988 the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has graciously led guided tours of the Dam. Buzzard's Roost overlooks Dover Dam and is a popular spot to visit either before or after a tour of the dam.

Other events tentatively planned include: rappelling, archery, indian games, horseshoes, totem pole carving, and black powder demonstrations. The organized events will begin with an 8:30 a.m. flag-raising on Saturday, May 4, and will conclude with an 8 p.m. campfire program at the Hoover Lodge amphitheater.

Groups may also choose to canoe the Tuscarawas River, through an arrangement with the NTR Canoe Livery in Bolivar. Transportation can be provided to and from camp. If your group intends to canoe, you must notify the camp Ranger by April 28. Groups that do not provide notification prior to this date must arrange their own transportation.

An afternoon Pioneer Point Program will explore the area's Native American history, and will give first-time Tuscazoar campers an opportunity to add their rock to the great memorial pile. A church service will be held Sunday morning at Tom's Chapel.

Campsites are still available. The \$5 per person activity fee includes all camp events, a souvenir patch and Saturday dinner. Camping and canoeing fees are additional. See you Friday, May 3!



## Work continues on latrine, water line; museum opening delayed

The grand opening ceremony for the W.C. Moorhead Museum has been tentatively rescheduled for Saturday, June 15, before the Great Tuscazoar Cook-Off. Camp maintenance efforts have been diverted to other more pressing needs, causing the delay. This date is also subject to change. Watch for further announcements.

Work is continuing on the water line for Hoover Lodge. A hole has been dug a holding tank below the lodge. The tank will be completed this spring. This project is being funded by a grant from the Albert W. & Edith V. Flower Charitable Trust.

The Foundation also hopes to complete the new latrine in Keppler field this spring. The roof and walls have been started. A grant from the Harold C. and Marjorie Q. Rosenberry Trust is funding this construction project.


