Fun-filled events planned for 1991 Dover Dam Extravaganza, May 3-5

A hot air balloon lift-off, an afternoon vesper service at Pioneer Point and a 24-foot climbing wall are part of the events planned for the 1991 Dover Dam Extravaganza May 3-5 at Camp Tuscazoar.

Once again, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers will offer guided tours of Dover Dam, despite limited manpower due to Operation Desert Storm. In addition, Appalachian Outfitters will display and demonstrate modern camping equipment and guided hiking tours of the camp will be offered. Saturday's activities will be capped off with a campfire in Hoover Lodge amphitheater.

NTR offers group canoeing discount

NTR Canoe Liveries, Inc. and the Camp Tuscazoar Foundation have reached an agreement which will allow group canoeing on the Tuscarawas River for a reduced rate.

The NTR livery is located four miles west of the camp at the 1-77 and Route 212 junction in Bolivar. The rates per person, which include life jackets, paddles, transportation to the starting point and orientation on river safety and basic canoeing, are:

Trip #1 (5 Miles)	\$8.00
Trip #2 (7 Miles)	\$11.00
Trip #3 (15 Miles)	\$13.00

The prices are based on the minimum price for two adults per canoe. Youth ages 6-12 are half price and children under 5 are free.

The agreement features special weekday discounts at last year's prices for groups of 10 or more. The discounts are:

10 to 19 people	15%
20 to 49 people	30%
50 or more people	40%

The NTR livery will also provide transportation from Camp Tuscazoar for 20 or more people. The group discount with transportation is:

20 to 49 people	15%
50 or more people	20%

These discounts apply only with advanced reservations and a deposit of \$3 per person or \$30 minimum. An additional \$2 per

person deposit is required on reservations received after Memorial Day.

Additional features available include handicapped canoeing, guided nature and history floats, food catering, picnicking, fishing and hiking.

The livery hours are seven days a week, 10.am. to 6 p.m. during June, July and August. In the spring and fall, the livery is open 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on weekends and will open on weekdays by reservation only.

Week-long camping, rate increase approved

The Camp Tuscazoar Foundation Board of Trustees voted recently to allow week-long camping by units at Tuscazoar. The rates for week-long unit camping will vary, depending on whether a cabin, adirondacks or tent sites will be utilized. Groups interested in camping for an entire week should contact Ranger Kevin O'Brien for reservations, rates and details.

Also, the Board of Trustees approved a rate increase of \$5 per weekend for Keppler Lodge, Hoover Lodge and Jamboree Lodge. As a result, the rates will increase effective September 1 to \$35 for Keppler, \$40 for Hoover and \$30 for Jamboree. This increase was necessitated by recent increases in maintenance costs, repair costs, trash removal fees and other various expenses.
