



Oct. 6 Pig Roast to include new treats: country music and buffalo

Smoked buffalo meat and country music by the professional country music band Little Country will highlight the Camp Tuscazoar Foundation's 2nd annual Pig Roast Fundraiser Oct. 6 at the Camp Tuscazoar dining hall.

Little Country, which has performed across the state of Ohio and is featured in a weekly television show on Channel 45, will be performing a variety of country music selections during the pig roast.

For those who prefer a western flavor to the meal, special smoked buffalo meat will be prepared by Foundation member Earl Sommers. The hearty menu will also include Amish pig cooked by expert chefs, applesauce, coleslaw, potatoes, bread and butter, assorted desserts and beverages.

The pig roast will be held from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. Pre-sale tickets are \$8 for adults, \$4 for children and are available by calling the camp at 859-2288 or from any Foundation trustee. Tickets purchased at the door will be priced slightly higher.

Transportation will be provided to and from the parking lot. In addition, many items such as patches, hats shirts, books and a unique "Pig" pin will be for sale.

Be sure to bring a camera to capture the fall foliage at Tuscazoar, bring your friends and, most importantly, bring an empty stomach. You won't leave hungry.
